Assignment #2 Chapter 1: Toward Civilization Notetaking (all 3 sections)

You are expected to read and take handwritten and detail-oriented notes on the first chapter of your book, *World History: Connections to Today* (Toward Civilization). We have a lot of material to cover in a short amount of time, so this will allow us to hit the ground running. My suggestion is that you have a separate college-ruled notebook in which you will keep all of your chapter outlines. Your notes will be checked on the first day of school

Assignment #3 Map of Europe & the Mediterranean

You are expected to label and study the locations which are on this map assignment. The map is due on the first day of class. The map quiz will be on **the second day of class**.

Course Description:

This course will cover the events and personalities that shaped the history of Europe from the ancient to early modern times. Through an examination of the development of nation-states, evolutionary and revolutionary movements, and global conflict, students will understand the relevance of the past to the present. Students in this course will be responsible for primary and secondary source reading materials and in-depth analysis of historical events. Additionally, the focus will be on extensive writing, research and critical presentation. The successful completion of a performance-based common task will be required of all students.

Topics:

September: Early Civilizations & Ancient Greece
October/November: Greece & Roman Empire
December/January-midterm exam: Middle Ages & Renaissance
February: Reformation & Nationalism
March: Absolutism & Enlightenment
April: French Revolution
May: Industrial Revolution
June: wrap up and finals

Grades:

Major Assessments are weighted as 60%, minor assessments are weighted as 30% and Homework is weighted as 10% of the quarterly grade.
